CROSS-CUTTING GUIDELINES

- Equity, anti-racism and non-discrimination
- Participant-centered and co-creative approaches
- Recognition, reciprocity, co-governance and Indigenous and youth leadership
- Psychosocial well-being and safe participation
- Relational responsibility and long-term engagement
- Respect for indigenous rights, knowledge systems and self-determination

PLAN

Seek free, prior and informed consent (FPIC). Engage diverse groups early and ensure fair compensation. Ensure participants' well-being through ethical protocols, cultural safety and linguistic inclusivity.

Ensure communities benefit by defining meaningful outcomes through a community-led process. Mitigate potential risks through adequate planning time.

IMPLEMENT

Create culturally safe spaces through dialogue, trust-building and active facilitation.

Use accessible tools and methods that support diverse participation and acknowledge participants' contributions.

FOLLOW-UP

Collect feedback and clarify how shared knowledge will be governed, stored, accessed, and shared, respecting Indigenous data sovereignty. Ensure participants receive accessible, culturally appropriate summaries.

Reflect on the process and maintain connections for future collaboration.
