Tech2Heal Official Launch Conference at ATU Donegal



Atlantic Technological University (ATU) Donegal hosted the official launch of Tech2Heal in Letterkenny on 2-3 April 2025, bringing together European healthcare experts, researchers, and innovators to explore digital solutions for rural and island healthcare.
