How to build impactful projects?

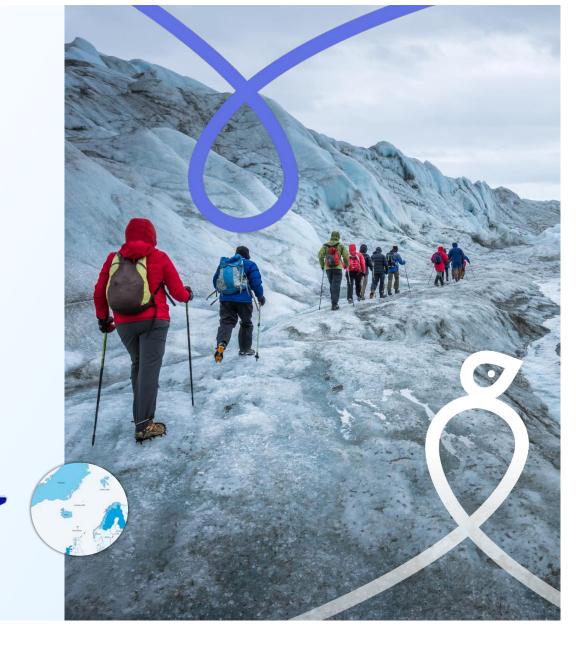
- With a strong project logic

The PROJECT

Describes how we move from the current situation to the intended situation and shows how this process aligns with the context.









Think all the way through

Organise resources, skills... and plan the work within the context



1st STEP - Define the context

Select the programme priority

- Priority 1: Innovation capacity
- Priority 2: Climate change and resource sufficiency
- Priority 3: Cooperation opportunities

Defines the output indicators

- Pilot actions
- Jointly developed solutions



Defines the result indicators

- Strategies and plans taken up
- Solutions scaled up



The project intervention logic

Include all the actors you need to take along to have an impact

Describe the impact

□ HOW

Describe what you will do to create that positive change

UPTAKERS

Those groups who will adopt and reuse the work creating the

positive change – most often groups of professionals or

policymakers.

END USERS

Those that will ultimately benefit from your work – often

citizens or SMEs, but also the environment or wildlife can be

"end users".

□ SCALE

The level of positive change you will create either within your

project lifetime or later when your work has been scaled up.

☐ TIME

Timeframe for when the positive change will happen.

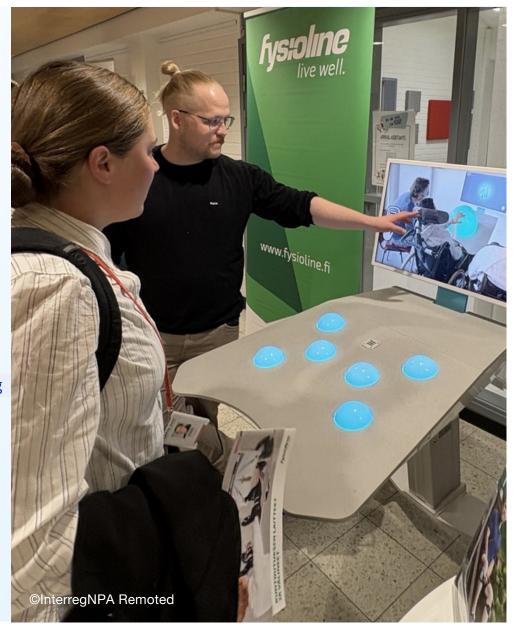

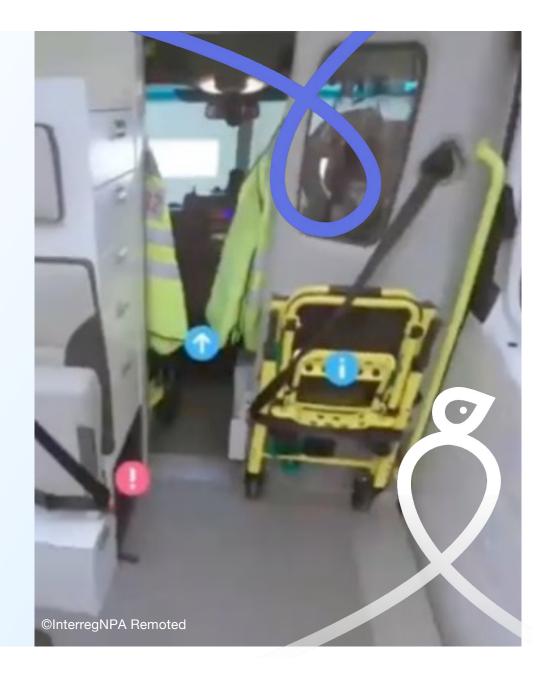

KNOW YOUR TAKERS

Barriers to to the uptake of project outputs!!!!!

- Lack of strong supporting strategic policy
- ★ Funding & Managing Expectation
- * Political/Policy change can lead to change of focus.
- * The urgent pushing out the important
- ★ The lack of a Champion (Internally and Externally)
- * Staffing change
- * Etc.....





Reasons for Participating in Co-Financed Projects for CCC

- Projects align with our delivery of core services.
- ★ Projects help us to build capacity in new and existing areas e.g. Housing, Tourism, Clustering
- ★ Provide added value to existing services e.g. LEOs, SME Supports
- ★ Transfer of Best Practise and Learnings e.g. Energy Efficiency, Coastal Erosion, Tourism
- ★ Financial Support for Innovation and Economic Development e.g. Small / Medium Piloting projects
- ★ Support available for Financial / Programme / Project management
- A champions is required.
- ★ Will there be a legacy?

How to build impactful NPA projects

BUILD A STRONG LOGIC

- 1. Understand the context and the actors
- 2. Write a complete overall objective, including: impact, approach and takers
- 3. Plan your resources and work based on the objectives

ENGAGE THE RELEVANT ACTORS

- 1. Know your takers and users
- 2. Include them in development and implementation
- 3. Customise your approach for different takers and levels of policy-maturity
